Decal replacements

The ink is fading on a small number of insurance decals. ICBC is replacing the faded decals of impacted motorists.

Background

Approximately 100 incidents of fading decals have been brought to ICBC's attention out of more than 2 million active number plate insurance decals currently on B.C. vehicles.

The impacted decal information includes the month and year of insurance expiration, the decal identification number and bar code.

Corrective steps

Motorists with faded decals can visit any Autoplan broker to get a free replacement.

ICBC has notified its third-party supplier that the ink quality on some batches of the decals do not meet the standards that ICBC, our partners, and customers expect.

ICBC is committed to remedying any issues arising from defective decals as quickly as possible.

Law enforcement options

Members of law enforcement who come across a motorist with a faded decal on their vehicle can advise that motorist to go to any Autoplan broker to have it replaced free of charge.

Members can continue to verify the validity of insurance using their computer systems or through the driver's insurance documentation.
